## Communication & language:

•Through a range of exciting opportunities, activities & learning the children will be able to practise the following skills.

#### •Listening & attention:

- •Giving eye contact when Speaking & Listening.
- Listening to & Following adult instructions.
- Joining in with repeated story phrases.
- •Listening one to one or in small groups & focusing attention.

#### •Understanding:

- Understanding & following instructions e.g To tidy up.
- •Following a simple repetitive story.
- Understanding 'why' & 'how' guestions.
- •Responding to ideas expressed by others.

#### •Speaking:

- •To reply to a greeting- "Hello" "Good Morning".
- •Using language to recreate roles & experiences during play.
- Using talk to organise, sequence & clarify thinking, ideas, feelings & events.
- •To give detail in their sentence e.g. a big, red, car.

## **Physical Development**

- •To practise hand-eye coordination, strength & control when using scissors, fine motor activities & mark making implements.
- •Understanding the importance of healthy eating & hygiene through discussions about handwashing, toileting, lunch, snack & brushing their teeth
- •Once settled at the end of the term the children will take part in weekly PE sessions where they will get changed & take part in physical activities which practice the skills of agility, balance & coordination.

## **Understanding of the World:**

- •The children will discuss the things they have observed in their new indoor & outdoor environments.
- •Through our RE topics & news, the children will discuss & describe special events with family & friends.
- •During this half term children will experience & have access to a range of technology including cameras, Clevertouch Boards, computers & iPads.
- •As part of our topic we will discuss different colours in our environment, investigate mixing colours & understand how rainbows are formed.

### **Literacy:**

- •During this half term we will consolidate phase 1 phonic skills & begin teaching Phase 2 phonemes (single letter sounds) using 'Little Wandle Letters & Sounds'.
- •With the use of name cards & phonics teaching we will practice cursive letter formations & pencil grip using cursive handwriting.
- •We will encourage the children to independently write their name using cursive formations. Name cards will also be sent home to enable them to practise their names in cursive at home.
- •The Children will receive a class Choosing Book and a Reading Book

#### The books we will focus on are:

- •The Colour Monster
- •Brown Bear Brown Bear (Eric Carle)
- Super Duper You
- •Elmer
- •A range of fiction & non-fiction texts & Poetry will also supplement the children's learning throughout the topic.

The children will be given an exciting range of mark making & writing opportunities across all areas of learning such as role-play, investigation & small world.

## **Mathematics:**

- Counting, saying numbers in order-1-10.
- Counting items saying number name for each item.
- •To know that the last number said when counting is the total of the group.
- •Number Blocks 1-5.
- •Recognise digits when shown at random 0-5 / 0-10.
- •Ordering numbers in sequence 1-5,1-10, 0-10.
- •1 more / 1 less than a number up to 5.
- •'2D shape names, days of the week & the date.

## Expressive art & design:

- •The children will investigate the use of line, shape & colour for a purpose, colour mixing & using a variety of media & materials.
- •The children will learn to sing songs with Sign-a-Long actions & be introduced to different rhythms.
- •Through the use of role play the children will engage in a range of narratives & storylines.
