

# St Mary's Infant School Sports Grant

## 2015/2016 and 2016/17

At St. Mary's Infant School we aim to maintain a culture that enables and encourages all children to be healthy and fit enjoying activity and keen to learn skills alongside each other. We aim to provide opportunities for all children to participate in a variety of sports and activities. We have established a number of after-school clubs for our pupils offering a wide variety of sporting opportunities for our children. We are constantly developing our PE programme.

### We aim to:

1. Improve the quality of the school P.E. programme by:
  - Auditing staff and planning to highlight development areas
  - Delivering P.E. focused staff training.
  - Investigate and explore good practice from other schools to further improve our P.E. curriculum
  
2. Using the opportunity for school sports days, theme weeks to provide further competitive opportunities for children and raise children's awareness of a healthy lifestyle.
  
3. Developing outdoor provision so that children have the opportunity to develop core strength and balance that will enhance their experience of physical activity. This will provide challenge and opportunity to take risks.

### Sport Premium Grant

Funding for schools will be calculated by the number of primary aged pupils (between the ages of 5 and 11) as at the annual census in January each year. All schools with 17 or more primary aged pupils will receive a lump sum of £8,000 plus a premium of £5 per pupil.
