




# ST MARY'S CATHOLIC NURSERY, INFANT & JUNIOR SCHOOLS NEWSLETTER OCTOBER 2016

#### Junior School

The chapel is now being used regularly for one to one meetings with the chaplain as well as weekly morning reflection and Chaplaincy Team meetings. In addition, as October is the month of the Holy Rosary, we have also prayed the Rosary during Thursday lunchtimes. Thank you to Chaplaincy Team members who have helped to lead this valuable time of prayer. The children have also learnt about St. Thérèse of Lisieux whose feast day was on 1st October. The chaplain led an assembly about her life and asked the children to think about how they could follow her Little Way: doing little things for God and for others. We hope you may have noticed some of these 'little' things at home.



Life seems so busy sometimes! We will be talking in school about the importance of talking and listening to each other. We know families have clubs to get to, homework to complete and shopping to buy, but we wonder if you and your family would like to join us and commit to sitting and sharing a meal together, without any screens, for one extra meal each week? ## School Office

Please be reminded that only prescribed medicines can be given in school by school staff (if prescribed four times a day). All other medicine will need to be administered by a parent or nominated person. For those with asthma, we have been advised that all children should have a small spacer in school and your child should know how to use the inhaler and spacer. This should be in a sealed clear plastic bag with your child's name on and you are responsible for taking this home half termly to clean.

Please remember that any absence from school must be reported to the school office on the morning by telephone (not by email) followed up in writing. Also, please advice the school office if someone other than your normal contacts is going to collect your child by phoning before 2pm. If later than this we can not guarantee getting the message to your child when calling late in the school day.
