"I wonder" takes away threat but promotes a wider opportunity to examine ideas whilst reinforcing a common language.


Do please try it


The top 50 shortlisted entrants (25 in each age category) will be invited to attend the final at Buckingham Palace There are prizes for the finalist detailed on the BBC website.

## News from Reception

Well done to all the Reception children for a great start to the year. The children have settled in well and are beginning to adjust to their new school routines. We began the term by reading our first two key texts; 'Brown Bear Brown Bear, What Do You See?' and 'Polar Bear Polar Bear, What Do You Hear?' The children enjoyed using their own listening ears and going on a listening walk, hearing sounds in the environment. We finished off the half term with 'Elmer's colours day' where the children dressed up in bright colours and enjoyed getting VERY messy! The children also created their own Elmer masks for our parade after reading another key text; 'Elmer'. The children have enjoyed our RE topic of 'Myself.' Throughout the topic, we learnt that prayer is a way of talking to God and that he knows us all by our name. We have now begun our 'Welcome' RE topic where the children have been learning about how they are welcomed and that we are welcomed into God's family when we are Baptised. We hope that you all enjoy a well-deserved rest over half term, and we look forward to starting our next topic 'My Adventures'.

Well done to the Year 1 children for a fantastic first half term. We are very proud of how hard they have been working and how well they have settled into their new classrooms. We have been artists, historians and writers while researching The Stone Age across a multitude of subjects, and welcoming a special guest into school to give us more of a background to Stone Age life. In Science, we have thoroughly enjoyed a range of experiments into light and how it works! We wish you all a lovely half term break and cannot wait to see you after the holidays.









## News from Year 4

Congratulations to year 4 for completing a busy half term. The highlight of the term has to be the lovely Harvest Mass in which the children read and fulfilled their duties excellently. The term has also seen the children investigate the human digestive system. We conducted an experiment to look at the effects certain liquids would have on an egg, we used an egg as a stand-in for teeth. The observations the children were able to make, in particular with the egg, which had been in the vinegar, were excellent. We hope the children have a lovely week away from school and look forward to seeing them back for Autumn 2.







## News from Year 5

In Year 5, in RE, we have been celebrating that each of us is unique and can make choices. Through the story of the Frog and the Scorpion, we have been thinking about how much control we have over those choices and who can help us as we make them. In our Science lessons on forces, we have had to make many choices when experimenting with parachutes, boats and levers, but have worked well together when being scientists. As writers this half term, we have made choices about what Lila (our character from Philip Pullmans' Firework Maker's Daughter) might face in our stories, and also chosen which mechanisms to include in our pop-up books about Athens and Sparta. Perhaps your child could retell their story to you over half term?





# News from Year 6

It has been a busy and exciting start to Year 6. It was an honour for the students to receive their privilege ties and badges in the assembly and we were also fortunate enough for the Year 6 students to organise the school feast day Mass at the start of September. We've had fun learning to classify organisms in science and we also used clay to make hieroglyphs which linked to our learning about the Maya in history.
