All Primary pupils, R-Year 6, will receive a free school meal from September 2023, for the Academic Year 2023/2024. Payments made to the Parent Pay dinner money accounts for which payment is not expected, creates errors which make processing refunds difficult. There is no payment due from any parent for dinners for the new academic year.

News from Reception










News from Year 3
