#### News from Reception

Well done to all the Reception children for a great start to the year. The children have settled in well and are beginning to adjust to new school routines. We began the term by reading our first two

key texts; 'Brown Bear Brown Bear, What Do You See?' and 'Polar Bear Polar Bear, What Do You Hear?' The children enjoyed creating their own listening ears and going on a listening walk, hearing sounds in the environment. We finished off the half term with 'Elmer's colours day' where the children dressed up in bright colours and enjoyed getting VERY messy! The children also created their own Elmer masks for our parade after reading another key text; 'Elmer'.

The children have enjoyed our RE topic of 'Myself.' Throughout the topic we discussed that prayer is a way of talking to God and that he knows us all by our name. We finished the topic by having a class service to reflect upon our learning throughout this half term. We have now begun our 'Welcome' topic where the children have been learning all about how they are welcomed and that they were welcomed into God's family when they were Baptised.



#### News from Year 1

Well done to all the Year 1 children for settling back into school life. We began our topic 'Enchanted Woodland' by exploring the school grounds using our senses. In Science the children have looked closely at different trees in our surrounding area and now know how to identify them based on their leaves and their seeds. In RE the children have learned about the love and care we get from our families. We have also been learning how to pray the Rosary during Liturgies. Our English learning this half term has been driven by the texts 'Little Red Riding Hood' and 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' where they have explored retelling the stories and the children created their own by changing the characters. In DT this half term the children enjoyed tasting porridge with different toppings and decided on their favourite to make for Baby Bear. Thank you for your continued support this half term. #### <u>News from Year 2</u>

We have had such a great start to year 2 with our topic of Muck, Mess and Mixtures. Children really enjoyed our 'Messy Morning' where they were able to experiment with creating their own wonderful mixtures just as Rufus did in our key text. In RE we discussed how God is at every beginning and thought of all the new beginnings we have experienced so far. We are now looking forward to our new topic of Street detectives.





#### <u>News from Year 3</u>

Year 3 have settled into Junior School life very well! Year 3 learners are quickly becoming Stone Age experts, inspired by our class text 'Stone Age Boy' in English and our history learning on this historical period. We even discovered some ancient looking artefacts in our grounds which caused much speculation as to whether they were Stone Age linked? Year 3 also transformed into cave artists, replicating shapes, animals and colours from the uncovered cave art dating back to the Stone Age period. In science, we have been learning through lots of active investigating within our topic of 'Light and Shadow', where our learning has been filled with torches, reflective materials and shadow measuring.





#### News from Year 4

What do a time-travelling dinosaur, green globby aliens, pirates, vampires and a carton of milk have in common? They all inspired year 4 children to make a great start to their writing skills this term. Following Dad's crazy adventures with these characters in our driver book 'Fortunately the Milk' not only led to some fantastic emotive and descriptive language but also reinvigorated all our imaginations. Another favourite this half term has been Science - finding out fascinating facts and watching stomach-churning simulations to learn more about the digestive system and teeth. In RE, we have reflected on what it means to be part of a family. Our current topic 'Called' has helped us to consider our own talents and why we've been chosen, as well as the talents of inspirational figures such as Nelson Mandela, who continues to teach us the important values of courage, compassion and forgiveness.





## <u>News from Year 5</u>

Year 5 children have been on quests this half term! We have loved following the adventures of Lila, a firework maker's daughter, as she searched for what she needed. Philip Pullman's novel inspired us to write extra chapters about Lila, and in these she met all sorts of strange and wonderful creatures. Sadly, she did not listen to the warnings she was given! In Science, we have been exploring forces. Making parachutes, foil boats and a chute for eggs to move down safely which allowed us to work like scientists, keeping records and drawing conclusions. In RE, we have considered whether commitment is important. Why not ask your child to tell you the story of the Scorpion and the Frog?





#### <u>News from Year 6</u>

Year 6 have had a busy start to the year! We were fortunate enough to be able to go on an educational visit to the Ecology centre in Carshalton, which tied in with our learning in Science this half-term. All three classes have presented their assemblies based on: reading, inspiring people and how we learn - hopefully inspiring those who attended! We have enjoyed learning about the Mayans in History this half-term, and this has linked in with other subject areas such as Art, in which we made our own hieroglyphs using clay.
