### News from Nursery

Hello from Froglets Nursery Classes! Wow! Half term already! We have had so much fun in nursery, the time has flown by! We have been learning about what happens in Autumn. We have talked about harvest, we have learned about what healthy foods we should eat and how they are grown on a farm and harvested in Autumn. Our favourite book this term has been Owl Babies. We built an owl's nest to play in and had role play masks of the mummy owl, and the baby owls Sarah, Percy and Bill. We hope all our Froglets and Froglet families have a lovely half term!



### News from Reception

Well done to all the Reception children for a great start to the year. The children have settled in well and are beginning to adjust to new school routines. We began the term by reading our first two key texts; 'Brown Bear Brown Bear, What Do You Hear?' And 'Polar Bear Polar Bear, What Do You Hear?' linked into our topic of 'Colourful Me'. The children enjoyed creating their own listening ears and going on a listening walk, hearing sounds in the environment.

We also had our 'Elmer's colours day' where the children dressed up in bright colours and enjoyed getting VERY messy! We finished off the half term by creating our own Elmer masks for our parade after reading another key text; 'Elmer'. The children performed three songs with signs and actions.

We have enjoyed our RE topic of 'Myself.' Throughout the topic we discussed that prayer is a way of talking to God and that he knows us all by our name. We finished the topic by having a class service to reflect upon our learning throughout the topic. We have also begun our 'Welcome' topic where the children have been learning all about how they are welcomed and that they were welcomed into God's family when they were Baptised.



### News from Year 1

Well done to all the Year 1 children for settling back into school life. We began our topic 'Enchanted Woodland' by exploring the school grounds using our senses. In Science the children have looked closely at different trees in our surrounding area and now know how to identify them based on their leaves and their seeds. In RE the children have learned about the love and care we get from our families. We have also been learning how to pray the rosary during Liturgies. The children enjoyed taking part in our Harvest Mass in the last week of term. Our English learning this half term has been driven by the texts 'Little Red Riding Hood' and 'Goldilocks and the Three Bears' where we have explored retelling the stories and created our own stories changing the characters. In DT this half term the children enjoyed tasting porridge with different toppings and deciding on their favourite to make for Baby Bear. We have finished off our topic with a Woodland day where the children had fun creating their own stickman and creating a woodland mobile. Thank you for your continued support this half term. Have a restful break and see you next half term. The Year 1 team.

## News from Year 2

It's been a busy and messy term in Year 2 with our Muck, Mess and Mixtures topic. Our English work has been based on The Rascally Cake and we loved our messy day making our own Rascally Cakes. We also tried something a bit healthier and made fruit kebabs, followed by writing a recipe for them. In science we have been exploring different materials and their properties, thinking about what makes them good for specific purposes. We have tried squishing, twisting, bending and stretching a variety of materials.

In maths we have finished our work on place value and are now doing addition and subtraction. Our RE topics have been 'Beginnings' and 'Signs and Symbols'. We have learnt about the creation story and about Baptism.

We have some keen artists in Year 2 and we have enjoyed learning about 3 artists and making our own versions of their work. The artists are Ilya Bolotowsky, Carl Warner and Giuseppe Arcimboldo.

## JUNIOR SCHOOL

### News from Year 3

Wow! What a start to the year we have had in Year 3. Having to learn all the new things that come with being a Junior school pupil, new building, teachers and expectations but we can gladly say that Year 3 have really taken this in their stride. We are proud to see how they have grown in maturity over the last 8 weeks and the hard work they have put into meeting these expectations.

Within our English learning, we have been exploring not the Story of the Three Little Pigs but the TRUE story of the Three Little Pigs! Where poor old Alexander T Wolf has been framed for the destruction of two houses and the consumption of two guilty pigs. Our crack team of investigative journalists in Year 3 have been learning all about newspapers, their layouts, language used and features in order to put forward their own newspaper report about these events. We hope to find justice for poor Alex T Wolf.

Within RE we have been exploring the different promises they make as well as the communities that they belong to. Whether they be their family community, church community or school community. Knowing that there are people out there who share things in common with them and how that relates to our teachings within the Catholic faith.

Finally, in Science we have been exploring Light and Shadow, whilst the Sun has not been on our side we've managed to have an extensive look into what light is, how shadows are formed and also exploring what the Sun is. Culminating in a shadow hunt around the school and also having a fun cross curricular day with English where we all made a shadow puppet theatre of the True Three Little Pigs story, complete with the children acting out in different ways.

We have been very proud of what they have achieved and look forward to seeing what they can do in the future



### News from Year 4

What does a time-travelling dinosaur, green globby aliens, pirates, vampires and a carton of milk have in common? They all inspired year 4 children to make a great start to their writing skills this term... Following Dad's crazy adventures with these characters in our driver book 'Fortunately the Milk' not only led to some fantastic emotive and descriptive language but also reinvigorated all our imaginations.

Another firm favourite among the children this half term has been Science - finding out fascinating facts and watching stomach-churning simulations to learn more about the digestive system and teeth. It wasn't just the tights-intestine demonstration that caused a stir in the classroom; ask your child about the alarming changes they observed to egg-shells left in various liquids.

In RE, we have reflected on what it means to be part of a family and have enjoyed creating and exploring our family trees. Our current topic 'Called' has helped us to consider our own talents and why we've been chosen, as well as the talents of inspirational figures such as Nelson Mandela, who continues to teach us important values of courage, compassion and forgiveness.



Our Digital Detox Day was met with some apprehension at first by children. "It will be like going back to the 80s," predicted one child! However, after a day filled with active tasks and creativity, lots of fresh air and fantastic learning outcomes, it was a definite success and one we look forward to firmly fixing in the future...

### **News from Year 5**

What a busy start to the new year it has been for Year 5! From the first day back in September the children have shown great enthusiasm throughout each lesson while making many new memories along the way.

In our English learning, we have been exploring the story of *The Butterfly Lion* by Michael Morpurgo, getting to know the characters of Bertie and Millie and their famous white lion. We have written diary entries and looked at character emotions and how they change throughout the events of a chapter. Moving then on into our second author focus of Anthony Browne. With his stories of *Zoo* and *Voices in the Park*, the children have really enjoyed exploring the illustrations and language used in the story to then collaboratively work together to create, design, write and illustrate their own version of *Voices in the Park*. Using the skills learnt in DT exploring different pop-up mechanisms, the children have incorporated these into their book to create a group Pop-Up book during our Digital Detox Day.

The children have been working extremely hard in their maths learning, looking back at their learning from last year and building on this knowledge. Within Addition and Subtraction, the children have really strengthened their knowledge on how to lay out their calculations using the column method and understand what it means to regroup when adding and exchange when subtraction and can explain why these are different too.

The children in 5 Elm also prepared and performed for the school assembly celebrating the languages spoken in the class. They now look forward to supporting their year group in 5 Birch and 5 Sycamore when it will be their assemblies next term too.

We are all so proud of the growing maturity across the year group this half term from the children and are looking forward to a busy half term coming up with more learning opportunities and memories to be made. We hope you all have a restful half-term holiday and want to thank you all for the continued support.

### **News from Year 6**



Ready, get set, go! It has been an amazing start to the new school year and the children have really hit the ground running. Everyone in Year 6 has returned to school eager and ready to learn, coming into school with lovely smiles each morning. This half-term the Year 6 children received their privilege ties and have been reflecting upon what privileges we have as individuals and as a community.

In our English learning we have been focusing on our set text 'The Amazon Diary' and using a range of skills to explore this topic including some very dramatic freeze-frames retelling the story. Through our learning we have thought about what life in the Amazon rainforest is like and what challenges people who live there might face- including the issues surrounding deforestation.



The children have been working extremely hard in their math's learning, looking back at their learning from last year and building on this knowledge. We were fortunate enough during our digital detox day to explore a completely different style of mathematics linked to our history topic. The children went outside and counted like the Ancient Maya using sticks and stones that they could find in their school grounds. They learnt to represent number in an entirely new way and considered which method they prefer (I think we will stick with column addition for now!).

Throughout our science we took another opportunity to go outside and further explore our amazing grounds. In our topic this half-term we have been exploring how to classify different living organisms and went outside to collect different leaves from our grounds and use classification keys to identify them. The children were brilliant in identifying and classifying their leaves and showed fantastic enthusiasm and dedication to their learning.



As well as all these amazing learning opportunities, we were also lucky enough to be invited to visit the Royal Opera House to watch a performance of the Magic Flute. The children loved watching this show and joined in singing with the performers with one of their pieces (the pa-pa song) with gusto.



It has been a fantastic start to the new school year and we are so proud of all the hard work and effort the children have shown so far. We hope you all have a restful half-term holiday and look forward to what the next half-term brings.
