## Spirituality

St Mary's is known for our blue uniform, but this week there were flashes of red around the school. Adults and children could wear an item of red clothing for **Red Wednesday**. This day, organised by Aid to the Church in Need (ACN), was a day to take action, pray and learn about those who are persecuted for their faith. Did you know that those found in possession of a Bible in North Korea could be jailed for their beliefs? Christians suffer persecution - from harassment to murder- in more countries than any other faith group. (Pew Research Centre). Year 5 also took action and supported ACN's campaign to #GO2MASS for someone who cannot by going to Mass at Holy Cross on Red Wednesday, for someone in Ukraine.

**Operation Elf** is another hugely popular campaign, this time organised by Pact (Prison Advice and Care Trust). Thank you so much for your support. Watch out for the winning children carrying their chocolate - they have been told not to eat it until you have said they may! The grand total of money raised at the Junior School was £393.23. This will be used to buy 26 gift cards which prisoners will be able to give to their children this Christmas. At the Infant School, the total money raised was £120; this will also be used to purchase gift cards for the prisoners to give to their children. This really is living out our faith and belief that everyone is special and is made in the image of God. Thank you.
